MARCH 1, 2021
Chairman Helgevold called the regular meeting of the Wright County Board of Supervisors to order at 9:00 a.m. Members present were Kluss, Rasmussen, and Helgevold. Minutes of the previous regular meeting of February 22, 2021 were read and approved.

Approved claims for payment.
Sandy McGrath with Public Health gave an update on the COVID cases in Wright County. There are currently 1,731 cases since March 2020. Wright County will be getting around 1,100 Johnson & Johnson vaccines. Wright County is one of 17 counties in the state that will be getting this vaccine.

There is a correction to the February 22nd minutes. It was reported that there were 1,761 COVID cases in the County since March 2020 and should have been 1,727.

Dean Kluss gave an update on the Agribusiness Park water supply. Kluss has been in contact with the Operations Manager on what needed to be done yet. Motion by Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to approve the Notice of Acceptability of Work as presented by ISG on the Water supply and approve the final pay estimate #6 to Beemer Companies in the amount of \$38,407.30. Motion carries.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to accept the resignation of Carol Ganzeveld as the Liberty Township Clerk and appoint Kathy Fletcher as Liberty Township Clerk with a term to expire December 31, 2022. Motion carries.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to approve the liquor license for the Nine and Dine in Eagle Grove. Motion carries.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to approve the hire of the two names provided pending pre-employment physical/drug screen and background check. The first position will be for the Truck Driver – Dows Maintenance Facility at a starting wage of \$22.29 per hour. The second position will be the Patrol Operator – Belmond Maintenance Facility with a starting wage of \$22.87 per hour. Motion carries unanimously.

Clemons then presented Resolution 2021-12 on awarding contract for Project FM-C099(96)-55-99 consisting of HMA Pavement Resurfacing with milling. Motion by Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to approve Resolution 2021-12 on awarding contract for the C20 project. By roll call vote: Ayes – Rasmussen, Kluss, and Helgevold; nays: none. Resolution 2021-12 duly passes and reads as follows:

Resurfacing with Milling; and **WHEREAS**, the Board has sought appropriate professional guidance for the concept and planning for the project and followed the steps as required by the Code of Iowa for notifications, hearings, and bidding/letting; and **WHEREAS**, The Board finds this resolution appropriate and necessary to protect, preserve, and improve the rights, privileges, property, peace, safety, health, welfare, comfort, and convenience of Wright County and its citizens, all as provided for in and permitted by section 331.301 of the Code of Iowa; and

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED by Board to accept the bid from Mathy Construction Company in the amount of \$1,199,392.08 and awards the associated contract(s) to the same;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all other resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed. If any part of this resolution is adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the resolution or action of The Board as a whole or any part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional. This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its approval as provided by law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Wright County, Iowa, that after receiving the necessary contract documents, including but not limited to, the contractor’s bond and certificate of insurance, Jeremy Purvis, P.E., the Engineer for Wright County, Iowa, be and is hereby designated, authorized, and empowered on behalf of the Board of Supervisors of said County to execute the contracts in connection with the afore awarded construction project let through the DOT for this county.

Dated at Wright County, Iowa, this 1st day of March, 2021. Clemons stated that all trucks went out on the 21st and 22nd for snow removal.

Held conference call with the Franklin County Board of Supervisors to discuss JDD 118-4 main open ditch estimate. Gallentine with CGA Engineering explained that there have been changes to the JDD 118-4 Main Open Ditch since the project started. Gallentine reached out to three (3) Drainage Contractors that have a long reach backhoes in Wright County and received one (1) estimate from Maier Trenching out of Eagle Grove, IA. Maier Trenching provided a \$40,000 estimate to do bed shaping due to deep cuts in the drainage ditch. Motion by Karl Helgevold, Wright County, and seconded by Chris Vanness, Franklin County, to approve the estimate from Maier Trenching in the amount of \$40,000. All ayes, motion carried.

The Clarion-Goldfield-Dows CSD Board of Directors held a Preliminary FY22 Budget Hearing, FY22 Calendar Hearing, and Regular Meeting on Monday, March 8, 2021. In attendance by Zoom was Cindy Dorn, Megan Ring, Delia Swanson, Tony Miller, Summer Traub, Adam Vorrre, and Heather Walker. Attending the meeting in person was Elizabeth Severson, Beth Jackson, Troy Seaba, Supt. Joseph Nelson, Elem. Principal Tricia Rosendahl, Reporter Bridget Shileny, and Board Secretary Anita Frye.
At 5:02 P.M. President Severson started the Preliminary Budget Hearing. No one addressed the board. Anita Frye presented the CGD FY22 Preliminary Budge, which included comparisons between the FY21 and FY22 Published Budgets. The FY22 Budget Hearing will be held on April 12, 2021 at 5:00 P.M.
The Board moved into the FY22 Calendar Hearing. No one addressed the board. Mr. Nelson presented the FY22 Calendar. The first day of school will be Monday, August 23rd with Elem/MS Back to School Conferences, and classes at the high school. The new addition is adding a Spring Break that aligns with colleges March 14-18, 2022. Graduation will be held on Sunday, May 15th, 2022. The last day of school pending snow days is scheduled for Tuesday, May 24th, 2022. The Board moved into its Regular Meeting. There were no visitors during Open Forum. Motion by Jackson to Approve the Agenda. Second by Seaba. Motion carried 4-0.
Superintendent Nelson shared with the board the Unofficial Revenue Purpose Statement Election results. There were 343 votes cast, with 312 yes votes, and 31 nay votes, passing at 91%.

Motion by Seaba to Approve 2-year Agreement with CGDEA. FY22 salary increase of 3.65%, total package increase of 3.06%, this allows step movement for all teachers according to years of service since FY19, with longevity addition of \$350.00 at Step 20 and Step 25. FY23 salary increase of 2.32%, total package increase of 1.96%, this includes base for all salary schedules to start at \$31,600.00, one step movement, and longevity addition of \$250.00 at Step 15, and \$400.00 at Step 20 and 25. Second by Ring. Motion carried 4-0.

Superintendent Nelson informed the board of his conversations with Dr. McLaughlin regarding mask protocol for the district, thus we will continue to wear masks through the end of the current school year with reevaluation ongoing. Our district gyms will open to City Rec starting March 15, 2021. Security cameras will be placed in transportation vehicles and buses on Monday, March 22, 2021. Supt. Nelson would like to implement a district wide four-day work week for the summer to save on energy costs. This would start June 4th, and end on Friday July 30th. The administration is working on plans for summer school in June, using ESSER II funds to help close the achievement gap.
